#### 1. Unpacking and assembling manual

- All the accessories of the vehicle are required to be installed after opening the package.
- a) Carry out the vehicle from the packing carton and put the vehicle on the floor after unpacking.
- b) Install the front wheel to the front right and left steering knuckles, and install the real wheel to the back shaft, make sure all the nuts being screwed tight and the cotter pin being plugged.
- c) Connect the lower end of the rear shock absorber and rear arm together, make sure the nuts being screwed tight.
- d) Install the handle bar to the steering and screw the nuts tight.
- e) Well sort all the cables and wires, and fasten. (Avoid hindering the operation of steering and fueling.)
- 2. Turn on the key switch.

Notice: you can use this vehicle normally when you start the vehicle successfully following the procedures above.

An ATV handles differently from other vehicles including motorcycles and cars, A collision or rollover can occur quickly, even during maneuvers such as turning and driving on hills or over obstacles, if you fail to take proper precautions.

## SEVERE IN JURY OR DEATH CAN RESULT IF YOU DO NOT FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTION:

- Read this manual and all labels carefully and follow the operating procedures described.
- Never operate an ATV without proper instruction. Take a training course. Beginners should receive training from a certified instructor. Contact an authorized ATV dealer to find out about the training courses nearest you.
- Always follow the age recommendation: A child under 16 years old should never operate an ATV with engine size greater than 90cc.
- Never allow a child under age 16 to operate an ATV without adult supervision, and never allow continued use of an ATV by a

- child if he or she does not have the abilities to operate it safely.
- Never carry a passenger on a ATV.
- Never operate an ATV on any paved surfaces, Including sidewalks, driveways, parking lots and streets.
- Never operate an ATV on any public street, road or highway, even a dirt or gravel one.
- Never operate an ATV without wearing an approved motorcycle
  helmet that fits properly. You should also wear eye
  protection(goggles or face shield),gloves, boots, long-sleeved
  shirt or jacket, and long pants.
- Never consume alcohol or drugs before or while operating this ATV.
- Never operate at excessive speeds. Always go at a speed that
  is proper for the terrain, visibility, operating conditions, and your
  experience.
- Never attempt wheelies, jumps or other stunts.
- Always inspect your ATV each time you use it to make sure it is in safe operating condition. Always follow the inspection and maintenance procedures and schedules described in this manual.
- Always keep both hands on the handlebars and both feet on the foot pegs of the ATV during operation.

- Always go slowly and be extra careful when operating on unfamiliar terrain. Always be alert to changing terrain conditions when operating the ATV.
- Never operate on excessively rough, slippery or loose terrain until you have learned and practiced the skills necessary to control the ATV on such terrain. Always be especially cautious on these kinds of terrain.
- Always follow proper procedures for turning at low speeds before attempting to turn at faster speeds. Do not turn at excessive speed.
- Never operate the ATV on hills too steep for the ATV or for your abilities. Practice on smaller hills before attempting larger hills.
- Always follow proper procedures for climbing hills as described in this manual. Check the terrain carefully before you start up and hill. Never climb hills with excessively slippery or loose surfaces. Shift your weight forward. Never open the throttle suddenly gear changes. Never go over the top of any hill at high speed.
- Always follow proper procedures for going down hills and for braking on hills as described in this manual. Check the terrain carefully before you start down any hill. Shift your weight backward. Never go down a hill at high speed. Avoid going

- down a hill at an angle that would cause the vehicle to lean sharply to one side. Go straight down the hill where possible.
- Always follow proper procedures for crossing the side of a hill as described in this manual. Avoid hills with excessively slippery or loose surfaces. Shift your weight to the uphill side of the ATV. Never attempt to turn the ATV around on any hill until you have mastered the turning technique described in this manual. Avoid hills with excessively slippery or loose surfaces. Shift your weight to the uphill side of the ATV. Never attempt to turn the ATV around on any hill until you have mastered the turning technique described in this manual on level ground. Avoid crossing the side of a steep hill if possible.
- Always use proper procedures if you stall or backwards when climbing a hill. To avoid speed when climbing a hill. If you stall or roll backwards, follow the special procedure for barking described in this manual.
- Always check for obstacles before operating in anew area.
   Never attempt to operate over large obstacles, such ad large rocks or fallen trees. Always follow proper procedures when operating over obstacles as described in this manual.
- Always be careful when skidding or sliding, Learn to safely control skidding or sliding by practicing at low speeds and on

- level, smooth terrain. On extremely slippery surfaces, such as ice, go slowly an be very cautious in order to reduce the chance of skidding out of control.
- Never operate an ATV in fast flowing water or in water deeper than that specified in this manual. Remember that wet brakes may have reduced stopping. Test you brakes after leaving water.
   If necessary, apply them several times to let friction dry out the linings.
- Always use the size and type of tires specified in this manual.
   Always maintain proper tire pressure as described in this manual.
- Never modify an ATV through improper installation or use of accessories.
- Never install a twist grip throttle on this ATV.
- Never exceed the stated load limits for an ATV. Cargo should be properly distributed and securely attached. Reduce speed and follow instructions in this manual for carrying cargo. Allow greater distance for braking.

substantial operating experience, do not ride this ATV. If you have not taken an ATV training course, take one before riding this ATV. Locate and read the Owner's Manual before Riding this ATV. Follow all instructions in the Owner's Manual when riding this ATV. Ride this ATV at small trouble openings and low speeds until you learn its performance and handling characteristics and develop respect and experience.

#### VEHICLE WARNING AND SPECIFICATION LABELS

Yours ATV comes with several labels containing important safety information. You and anyone who operates the vehicle should read understand this information before riding.

- The labels should be considered permanent parts of the vehicle. Do not remove the label for any reason.
- If any label is missing, damaged, worn, or becomes difficult to read. contact your dealer for replacements.
- Always replace labels in the paper location.



### 3. Product information



#### VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION

The identification numbers found on your vehicle identify it from others of the same model type.

Your may need the identification numbers when ordering replacement parts, service information, or to assist in the investigation and recovery.

Record your vehicle identification numbers in the spaces provided. Keep a copy of the numbers in another location.

## 4. Operation

- Please wear the protective garments and equipments before riding. And please ride in the open air without other peoples.
- 2. Insert the key of the electric lock.
- 3. The Hall hand grip is a speed control device, which is linearly proportional to the power voltage and motor speed. So it will reach the maximum speed if the Hall hand grip to be turned to the end. Please adjust it to the appropriate speed when driving.
- When driving, please watch the coulomb meter always and make sure there's enough electric quantity to support the vehicle to go back.
- Please charge the battery when you find there is only one grid shown on the coulombmeter or poorer performance of the vehicle. Do not charge frequently, otherwise the battery life will be reduced.

#### 5. Maintenance

- Please note the conventional maintenance is required.
- Do not close to the fire. To avoid the expansion and deformation even explosion caused by the heated battery.
- Please charge the vehicles in time when it has been idle for a certain time.

- 4. Please lubricate the chain, as appropriate.
- 5. Inspect the chain loose or tighten on time. Press the chain, the stroke should be between 15-20mm.
- Please do not modify the circuit if not a professional, to avoid the electric shock accidents.
- 7. Please don't climb the steep hills always when driving, to avoid the fuse blowout caused by the overdrive.
- 8. Please inspect the tire pressure before and after riding.
